

Looking for a New Year's Resolution? How about quitting smoking or smoking cessation?

Protect your child's developing lungs! Second hand smoke causes numerous health problems in infants and children, including more frequent and severe asthma attacks, respiratory infections, ear infections and sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).

Did you know that...

- Smoking during pregnancy results is more than 1,000 infant deaths each year?
- Second hand smoke can increase risk of coronary artery disease, stroke, and lung cancer in adults.
- You can help protect your child's lungs: Don't smoke in or near your home; don't smoke in the car, even with windows open; choose smoke-free schools and daycare; avoid public areas with smoking, even with a non-smoking section; stop smoking!

Winter...A fun time for hot chocolate, snowmen, and unfortunately.... NOSEBLEEDS

- Pinch your child's nostrils together, just below the bridge of the nose. Continuous pressure to the nostrils for 7-10 minutes will allow bleeding to stop
- Don't tilt your child's head back. This will cause blood to run down the throat
- -Don't have your child blow his or her nose. This will cause more nosebleeds
- -Apply nasal spray and petroleum jelly (for example, Vaseline or Aquaphor) to your child's inner nostrils to help keep them moist
- -Call your doctor if your child has 3 or more nosebleeds per day OR if a nosebleed lasts longer than 30 minutes with direct pressure
